



Your Story - Your Voice

We all have a story that is uniquely and completely ours. A story that we may not have always had complete control of, but one that is still being written.

At MADD Arizona, we believe in helping anyone who wants to share their story by giving them their voice back to share about their love, loss, and commitment to bringing an end to impaired driving.

As sharing is a personal choice, we will NEVER take advantage of that story or force anyone to share anything they do not want to. But we also know many people have found healing through talking about their experiences and to honor this, we provide several opportunities to do this.

Although those opportunities are endless, here are a few things we have upcoming where we are always looking for people who want to share their story:

Victim Impact Panels



Each speaker is given 30 minutes to share to a room of DUI offenders to help them make better choices to keep themselves and our communities safe

MADD Events



At each of our events, we have a mission moment to remind our community why we do the work we do, such as: Vigils, Walk Like MADD, and our banquets

Holiday Campaigns & Interviews



Each year during the holiday season, news outlets ask us to participate in interviews to spread our message during peak DUI events

You are the only one who can share your story, we're just grateful you've allowed us to be a part of it

Interested in sharing, learning more, or don't know where to begin?

We understand that even if you want to share, you may not even know how to start. Whether you struggle being able to write down your story, talk about it, or have a fear of public speaking, we're here to help.
